## JOINT STATEMENT CONDEMNING ATTACKS TARGETING ACCESS TO JUSTICE

We, the undersigned organizations, unequivocally denounce President Trump's unfounded and vindictive memorandum, "Preventing Abuses of the Legal System and the Federal Court," as well as the Executive Orders targeting specific law firms that engaged in litigation against government abuse and misconduct in prior administrations. These directives targeting lawyers and legal institutions that regularly challenge abusive state power are a grave attack on one of the fundamental pillars of our democracy: the ability to seek justice through an independent legal system. Like the many actions the Trump administration has taken in the last two months, the memo seeks to silence dissent and erode the infrastructure of support for the most underserved and targeted communities, including immigrants and human rights defenders.

As a movement, we know that neither lawyers nor the legal system can on their own create the fundamental transformation needed to achieve justice. But lawyers who help people navigate the legal system can provide a backstop against the worst harms by educating people about their rights, representing them in proceedings that are stacked against impacted communities, and taking up more systematic challenges in federal court to unlawful policies and practices. Even with these protections, rights violations are rampant. Law firms, lawyers, and immigration organizations play a key role in providing critical legal services to our communities.

The transparent purpose of the March 22 memorandum and the missives naming specific firms is to create a chilling effect on attorneys who zealously advocate for their clients, and to introduce an element of fear and uncertainty for litigators who use the legal system our country depends on to vindicate their clients' rights. The ramifications of targeting attorneys doing their jobs would be dire, depriving the most vulnerable individuals of their right to counsel and disrupting our collective ability to challenge government overreach. Democracy cannot exist when access to justice is curtailed.

Immigrant communities are already uniquely at risk because of this administration's efforts to intimidate the attorneys and advocates who are accountable to them. From false and racist declarations of "invasion" to the enforced disappearance of immigrant activists for Palestine and removal of asylum seekers in third countries, we know the administration's disdain for the rule of law is profound. Since day one, this administration has been on a retaliatory campaign against anyone who stands up to their cruel and inhumane policies - whether domestically or internationally. The attacks on attorneys, legal infrastructure and the law itself is a hallmark of fascism that attempts to eliminate a key tool to disrupt and challenge executive power.

As legal advocacy groups, civil and human rights organizations, and advocates for justice, we stand united in our opposition to this attack on the right to counsel. We will continue to use every tool at our disposal to protect the rights of our movements and communities and to promote a world where human rights, dignity, and flourishing are protected. We will come to each others' defense when needed, and we will continue to provide our movement and our communities with the zealous representation they need and deserve.
