

## SAMPLE IMMIGRATION COURT WATCH OBSERVATION FORM

In May 2025, advocates began hearing reports spreading across the country of ICE trial attorneys moving to dismiss pending cases in immigration court. Those people whose cases are dismissed are then arrested by ICE officers in or outside of the court and put into expedited removal proceedings. Many rapid response networks have shifted resources to court watching in order to monitor and report out trends in these dismissals and arrests.

This document is intended only to suggest what information might be useful to collect while ICE is conducting arrests in immigration courts. People interested in deeper thinking on court watch projects can refer to existing resources for more information. Some existing options are from <a href="HOPE Border">HOPE Border</a>
<a href="Institute">Institute</a>, <a href="Advocates for Human Rights">Advocates for Human Rights</a>, and <a href="the ABA">the ABA</a> has a national court watch project that people can consider. <a href="The National Immigration Project">The National Immigration Project</a> is not coordinating court watch efforts and you do not need to return any data collected to us.

This document contemplates in-person observation, where the court watcher is in the court, but could be adapted for WebEx Court Watch to just monitor for dismissals. This document does not encourage or direct any action during hearings or arrests. Please do not record anything (audio, video, or photos) during a hearing.

This sample is designed with two sections: Page 1 is a summary of the observer's shift of court watching; Page 2 is a record of each hearing observed. It is recommended to print multiple copies of Page 2 for court watch shifts.

Depending on your court watch program and volunteer availability, it might be more efficient to divide observers up and have some in the courtrooms watching hearings and others in the lobby, hallways, or outside the court monitoring for arrests. In this case, one observer may not have all of the information requested on Page 1, and would need to coordinate with another observer to capture all of the recommended data.

This sample does not recommend collecting and recording personal identifying information (PII) like name or A-number. In general, PII should **only** be collected if you intend to provide services to the person whose PII you collect. If you do collect PII, please be thoughtful when electronically storing this data. Consider encrypted platforms like CryptPad or Proton Drive and communicating on platforms like Signal. Summaries of courtwatch should generally be anonymized.
