



# **A GUIDE TO REQUESTING A FEE WAIVER IN IMMIGRATION COURT**

*Last Updated: August 31, 2025*

Are you unable to pay the filing fee for an application, motion, or appeal to the immigration court or Board of Immigration Appeals? If so, you may qualify for a fee waiver. This guide walks you through the steps to file a Fee Waiver Request.

**This guide is not a substitute for independent legal advice supplied by a lawyer familiar with your case.**

# **1. Who is this guide for?**

This guide is for **“pro se”** people who are in **“removal proceedings”** in immigration court who cannot afford to pay a filing fee associated with an application, motion, or appeal to the Immigration Court or Board of Immigration Appeals.

**“Pro se”** is a legal term that means people who are representing themselves without a lawyer.

**“Removal proceedings”** are also known as deportation proceedings. They are hearings held before an immigration judge to decide whether the person can be deported.

If you cannot afford to pay a filing fee, you can ask the Immigration Judge or the Board of Immigration Appeals to waive the filing fee by submitting a **Fee Waiver Request** with your completed application, motion, or appeal.

**NOTE:** This guide is intended for people who already know what application, motion, or appeal they want to file. It does not explain in detail what specific applications, motions, or appeals can or should be filed in any particular case. Instead, this guide only provides instructions for a request for a fee waiver.

## **2. What are the filing fees for common applications and motions?**

Congress passed and President Trump signed a new law on July 4, 2025, that creates new immigration-related fees and increases fees for some immigration court filings. Here is a list of fees for common applications and motions:

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<sup>1</sup> There is no fee for an application for withholding of removal or protection under the Convention Against Torture.

<sup>2</sup> There is no fee for a motion to reopen an *in absentia* removal order because of a lack of notice. Note that this fee *does* apply to a motion to reopen an *in absentia* removal order based on exceptional circumstances.

<sup>3</sup> There is no fee for appeals of bond decisions by an immigration judge.

### **3. How do I submit my Fee Waiver Request?**

You must submit your Fee Waiver Request to the Immigration Court<sup>4</sup> or Board of Immigration Appeals that will consider your application, motion, or appeal.

If you are requesting a waiver from the **Board of Immigration Appeals**, you must file a [Fee Waiver Request \(Form EOIR-26A\)](#) along with your notice of appeal or motion. Instructions for completing this form are included below.

If you are requesting a waiver from the **Immigration Court**, you must provide an affidavit or declaration explaining why you cannot pay the fee. Even though it is not required, the Fee Waiver Request (Form EOIR-26A) can be filed with the immigration court as well.

**WARNING:** Do **NOT** lie about your financial situation in your Fee Waiver Request. You could face serious consequences if you commit fraud or misrepresentation.

**For asylum applications:** As of the writing of this guide, the government has not yet set up a system for payment of the \$100 asylum filing fee. You should be able to submit your asylum application in immigration court without the fee and pay it later to USCIS once that agency has set up a payment process for immigration court-based filings. If the judge refuses to accept your application without the filing fee, you can submit a “Motion to Authorize Provisional Acceptance of Asylum Application.” A template motion is provided in this guide below.

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<sup>4</sup> By regulation, fees connected to Immigration Court filings are paid to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). Immigration Courts do not and cannot accept payments. However, Immigration Judges are authorized to adjudicate fee waiver requests. Unfortunately, USCIS has yet to operationalize its system to accept payment for Immigration Court filings leading to a lot of confusion.

## **4. What happens next?**

The Immigration Court or Board of Immigration Appeals will decide your fee waiver request. If granted, you will either be issued a refund (if you have already paid) or your application, motion, or appeal will be accepted for consideration without the fee.

If your fee waiver request is denied, the Immigration Court or Board of Immigration Appeals must give you 15 days from the date of the denial to re-file your application, motion, or appeal with the filing fee or a new fee waiver request. Any filing deadline for your application, motion, or appeal will be extended for these 15 days.

**Make sure you stay on top of your case and don't miss any notices by the court regarding your fee waiver request!**

To check the status of your case, you can call the Immigration Court or the Board of Immigration Appeals where your fee waiver request is pending. The phone number for the Board of Immigration Appeals is: 703-605-1007. A list of all Immigration Courts and their phone numbers is included at the end of this guide.

You can also try checking the status of your case using the automated system by visiting <https://acis.eoir.justice.gov/> or calling 1-800-898-7180. You need to know (1) your A number, which begins with the letter A and is followed by an 8- or 9-digit number; and (2) your nationality.

## **5. Checklist for Fee Waiver Request**

Below are template documents that you will need to prepare your Fee Waiver Request. You can complete it on your computer or print it out (single-sided) and write legibly in blue or black ink. You must complete this in English. Follow these instructions to make sure you are completing it correctly:

### **Cover Letter**

- ☐ Complete the greyed-out lines with your information.
  - Enter the date at the top.
  - Under “To,” include the name of the Immigration Court (for example, the “Chicago Immigration Court”) or the Board of Immigration Appeals and their address.
  - Include your name and A-number.
  - In the first paragraph, enter the application, motion, or appeal that your fee waiver request is filed in connection with.
  - At the beginning of the second page, include any specific reasons why you cannot afford the filing fee.
    - Consider including any of the following information if applicable:
      - You are unable to work because of a disability, medical issue, or you do not have authorization to work.
      - You have a large amount of expenses like medical bills for yourself or a dependent.
      - You are detained and unable to generate any income.
      - You have any family members that rely on you and why they cannot assist you with the fee.
  - Mention any evidence you are attaching. For example, this could include an affidavit or declaration from you or others in your household explaining your financial circumstances, tax returns, pay stubs, bills, etc.
- ☐ Sign at the bottom of the letter.

## **Fee Waiver Request (Form EOIR-26A)**

☐ Enter your Name and A Number. Your A Number begins with the letter A and is followed by an 8- or 9-digit number. This number is likely on your immigration documents.

☐ Under the section that says “**AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF FEE WAIVER REQUEST**,” add your name, your signature, and the date. By signing here, you are swearing that the information you are submitting is true and correct to the best of your knowledge and that you understand that you could face legal consequences if the information is later proven to be false.

☐ **1.** In the table titled “Income Sources,” enter your monthly income from these sources:

- Employment, including self-employment
- Income from property (such as rental income)
- Interest from checking and/or saving account(s)
- All other income, including but not limited to these and other sources: alimony, child support, interest, dividends, social security, annuities, unemployment, public assistance, etc.

You must list the total amount of money you earned before any taxes, deductions, or withholdings were taken out.

**WARNING:** If you are not detained, your fee waiver request may be denied if you list all zeros for all income sources without any additional evidence to explain why you have no income. If you have no income, make sure you attach a declaration and/or additional evidence to explain your circumstances.

Remember not to make any statements that are inconsistent with any other representations you have made to the immigration court about your financial situation.

☐ In box **1.A.**, add up your total average monthly income. If you are completing this on your computer, this box may populate on its own. Double check that it is the correct amount.

☐ **2.** In the table titled “Expense Sources,” enter your monthly expenses from these sources:

- Rent or home-mortgage payments
- Utilities (electricity, heating fuel, water, sewer, telephone, internet, etc.)
- Installment payments or outstanding debits (credit card(s), store credit card(s), vehicle payment, personal loan(s), etc., but not including rent or home-mortgage payments)
- Living expenses (food, clothing, transportation, child care, tuition, etc.)
- All other expenses, including but not limited to these and other sources: alimony, child support, insurance, medical, health, any state or federal taxes, attorney fees, etc.

**WARNING:** If you are not detained, your fee waiver request may be denied if you list all zeros for all expense sources without any additional evidence to explain why you have no expenses. If you have no expenses, make sure you attach a declaration and/or additional evidence to explain your circumstances.

Remember not to make any statements that are inconsistent with any other representations you have made to the immigration court about your financial situation.

☐ In box **2.B.**, add up your total average monthly expenses. If you are completing this on your computer, this box may populate on its own. Double check that it is the correct amount.

☐ **3.** To calculate the total, subtract your total average monthly expenses from your total average monthly income. If you are completing this on your computer, these boxes should populate on their own. Double check that it is the correct amount.



- ☐ 4. In this box, you can add any additional information that would help explain why you cannot pay the filing fee. You can mention that you have included an additional explanation in your cover letter and mention any documents you are attaching as evidence.
- ☐ Since you do not have a lawyer, you can leave blank the section titled “Attorney or Representative.”
- ☐ Make two copies of everything. Scan or take a picture of everything to keep for your records. You may also want to email yourself a copy so that you have a record in case you lost the hardcopy or can’t access the scanned version on your computer.
- ☐ Mail this cover letter and form along with your completed application, motion, or appeal. Remember to mail one copy to the court and one copy to the government attorney. A list of all Immigration Courts and government attorney offices is included in the attachment at the end of this guide. Keep the mail receipt with your records.
- ☐ If you do not hear back from the court, call the court to find out if they have received your fee waiver request and what the decision was. Continue checking to see when the request is decided. You can set reminders on your phone or calendar to check every day!
- ☐ If your request is denied, make sure you resubmit your application within 15 days of the denial with the filing fee or a new fee waiver request.

I, the above-mentioned Respondent, respectfully request a fee waiver in connection with my \_\_\_\_\_.

In support of my filing, I am including the Fee Waiver Request Form (EOIR-26A). I have affirmed under penalty of perjury that the information contained in the Fee Waiver Request Form is true and correct to the best of my knowledge as required by 8 C.F.R. § 1003.24(d); 8 C.F.R. § 1003.8(a)(3).

On July 3, 2025, Congress passed H.R. 1, which became Pub. L. 119-21, 139 Stat. 72 (“H.R. 1”) on July 4, 2025. The law substantially increased the fees associated with various immigration court filings, including the above-referenced filing. I received little notice of this substantial increase and therefore, I respectfully request that this court approve my fee waiver request.

H.R. 1 does not affect the validity of the Executive Office for Immigration Review’s (EOIR) fee waiver request form, Form EOIR-26A. EOIR Policy Memorandum 25-36 at 2. Further, the guidance contained in EOIR Policy Memorandum 21-10 regarding practices for the adjudication of fee waiver requests remains valid. *Id.* EOIR Policy Memorandum 21-10 states, in part, that, “Each fee waiver request is assessed on its own merits, and EOIR has no policy directing the automatic grant or denial of a fee waiver request. IJs and AIJs retain independent judgment and discretion in assessing fee waiver requests.” EOIR Policy Memorandum 21-10 at 2. Thus, this court may still grant a fee waiver request if a respondent can show that they are unable to pay the filing fee. *See* Immigration Court Practice Manual §3.4(c)-(d); BIA Practice Manual §3.4(c)-(d). Here, the court should grant my fee waiver request because of the following reasons:

I declare under penalty of perjury that the reasons listed above are true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

Pursuant to the regulations, if a fee waiver request does not establish the inability to pay the required fee, the respondent should receive a rejection notice and the appeal or motion will be returned. However, the respondent will receive 15-days to re-file the rejected appeal or motion with the fee or new fee waiver request, and any applicable filing deadline will be tolled during the 15-day cure period. *See* 8 C.F.R. § 1003.24(d); 8 C.F.R. § 1003.8(a)(3). As such, if the court does not grant my fee waiver request, the court must toll the filing deadline for 15 days to allow me to cure the filing. *See* 8 C.F.R. § 1003.24(d); 8 C.F.R. § 1003.8(a)(3).

The Immigration Judge may grant your fee waiver request for an EOIR application or motion filed with the Immigration Court if you show that you are unable to pay the filing fee. The Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) may grant your fee waiver request for an appeal or motion filed with the BIA if you show that you are unable to pay the filing fee. If this fee waiver request does not establish your inability to pay the required fee, your application, motion, application, or appeal will not be deemed properly filed. 8 C.F.R. §§ 1003.8 and 1003.24(d). You must answer all questions on the form even if the answer is "\$0.00".

Therefore, I respectfully move this Honorable Court to provisionally accept my asylum application while EOIR develops a mechanism to collect my \$100 asylum fee and informs me of that mechanism.
